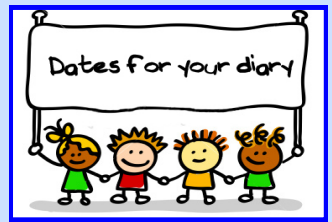

Track the Speaker

What is it?

'Track the Speaker' means using eyes and body language to follow whoever is speaking – the teacher, teaching assistant or another child.

Why does it help?

When children track the speaker, they stay focused and process information better. It helps them pick up on facial expressions and gestures that add meaning to words, and shows respect for whoever is speaking.

What you'll notice at home

Your child might start reminding you to "track the speaker" during family conversations! This is a great sign – it shows they're developing active listening skills that will help them throughout life.

How you can support

Encourage your child to look at you when you're speaking to them at home. Model it yourself by giving them your full attention when they're talking. These small habits build powerful learning skills.
