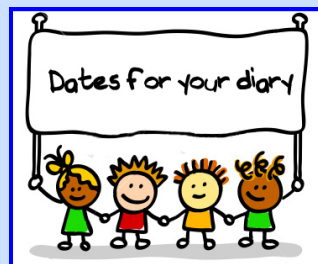

## Year 3 Visit from St John Ambulance

Year 3 had an exciting and informative visit from St John Ambulance, where they learned important first aid skills.

The children were taught what questions to expect if they ever need to call for help. They learned to check if a patient is breathing and responsive, and to give key information such as the address of the emergency. They also discovered that call handlers may ask for details like their name, the patient's name, and the patient's age or sex if known.

The session also covered how to treat bites and stings. Pupils learned the importance of hygiene, including using alcohol gel to clean their hands, wearing gloves, and carefully cleaning the skin.

In addition, the children explored the signs and symptoms of an allergic reaction and how to help someone experiencing one. They were particularly interested in looking at training EpiPens, which helped them understand how these life-saving devices are used.

It was a valuable and engaging experience, and the children gained important knowledge that could help them respond in an emergency.
